Electrical Permit Clarifications

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Mobile Homes & Modular Homes:

→ When installing a site service in a park, the permit application should include: #1, the application fee, the appropriate service fee, #2-#5 and #17, the park site fee. The number of items is based on the number of park sites.

→ When setting a mobile home in a park, the permit application should include #1, the application fee and #16, the feeder fee.

→ When setting a mobile home or a modular home on private property, the permit application should include #1, the application fee, then one of the appropriate service fees, #2-#5, also, #16 to feed the service to the home. If the home will be hooked up to a well then #19 should be selected. If the holding tank is under the house then #7, for circuits and #8, for lighting fixtures, should be selected too.

Plan Reviews are not required for the following:

→ Buildings that have calculated floor areas less than or equal to 3500 square feet and have the service or feeder with 400 amps or less. The administrative authority may request plans for projects that include unusual design.

→ Work completed by a governmental subdivision or state agency costing less than \$15,000.

→ Alterations and repair work determined by the electrical official to be of a minor nature.

Plans are required for all other building types and shall be prepared by or under the direct supervision of an architect or engineer licensed pursuant to Act No. 299 of the Public Acts of 1980, as amended, and shall bear that architect's or engineer's signature and seal. Plans must be submitted before a permit can be issued.

General Procedures:

Electrical work shall not be started until the application for permit has been filed with the Grand Traverse County Construction Code Office. All installations shall conform with the State Electrical Code. No work shall be concealed until it has been inspected. To request an inspection, provide as much notice as possible, and call the office at 231-995-6049 with your permit number and the location. Inspection requests will not be taken over the phone without your permit number.

Expiration of Permit: (80.19.3 Part 8, 2002)

Every permit issued by the code official under the provisions of this code shall expire by limitation and become null and void if the work authorized by such permit is not commenced within 180 days from the date of such permit, or if the work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned at any time after the work is commenced for a period of 180 days.

Transfer of Permit: (80.19.8, Part 8, 2002)

An electrical permit is not transferable.

Uncompleted installation notification: (80.19.4 Part, 2002)

If a person to whom a permit is issued for the installation and inspection of electrical conductors and electrical equipment quits the installation for any reason, then the person shall notify the administrative authority.
